With respect to playing results for the year, the club made finals in all competitive age groups with the exception of the under 12s. This is a big improvement on last year, especially in the under 14s where both groups of boys had struggled to win games the year before but stuck with it and ended up with finals berths in 14/1s & 14/2s. Our two combined sides in the under 16s with the Magpies both played in finals.

Finally, I would like to thank all of you for your continued participation or initial participation in the club as either a parent or player. Without you we don't have a club. For those of us that have been here a while, we love our little club. It has a proud history and we want to see it continue to grow and prosper.

The Belconnen Cats U/9's team enjoyed a fantastic year of football which saw the squad operate as a single group playing and training together with team division organised on each Saturday to ensure all the boys got to know each other and form both playing and personal friendships.

We started the year with only a handful of players with very strong skills who could really dominate games, but by the end of the season all regular players had improved dramatically. Key skills of handpassing, kicking to open players, attacking the ball and using body position and matching up with opposition numbers had really registered with the boys. Responding to coaching and learning through experience was also evident, with many later games seeing the ball transition through many pairs of hands quickly to goal.

Importantly we saw a development of skills in certain areas spread across the group. Some have very strong marking and kicking skills, several read the game very well and their capabilities were recognised with opportunities to play with the U/10's group towards the end of the season. Others have demonstrated hardness at the football, and unique natural abilities to put their head over the ball and make a contest. While on the whole the group lack height, there are a few very good club development candidates for tall players, a couple of which really blossomed and achieved an understanding of their natural attributes. Importantly this group is rich with natural athletes, with a large proportion of the group demonstrating an ability and desire to push their aerobic capacities, even at a young age.

The strategy of developing the group as a single unit has paid strong benefits for the club both this year and in years to come, as we now have around 15 established players who will grow as a group and provide the club with skills and numbers in their age bracket. Importantly, by the time they are playing competitive football, they will have been playing together since they were very young.

Thanks to all the boys for their commitment and applied learning all season. Special thanks go to the parent group who all supported the club and contributed in washing jumpers, bringing oranges, and bringing their skills, knowledge and encouragement to support team development. Well done all on a great year!
